Impact Report 2017





The support of the UCS community is vital to the school and the future of its pupils. With each September comes the anticipation of what the academic year ahead will hold and we have been so impressed by how the UCS community has come together in its support of our quest to build on the bursary provision offered and in continuing to improve the school's facilities.

You will know that the new Sports Pavilion construction is underway with £1.25m given towards this project from current parents and Old Gowers.

£325,000 has been given and pledged this year in support of bursaries. This represents a further sixteen years worth of bursaries we can offer which would give two pupils a full sevenyear education at UCS. Thanks to the funds raised for the Kenneth Durham Memorial Bursary, four students so far will be fully supported throughout their sixth form careers. The Junior Branch has raised £74,000 which will be used to fund the school's programme of installing specialised, state-of-the-art classroom furniture and interactive smart boards. This combination is transforming the learning experience of all the boys in the JB and brings a very modern feel to the classrooms.

We are also delighted to announce that in November 2018 the UCS Centre for Innovation in Learning and Teaching (CILT) is expected to open, thanks to the visionary support we have received for this project from the AKO Foundation.

This report is an opportunity to thank you once again for the many ways you have supported UCS, a school we are so proud to be a part of and which, without your support, would be a different place. We look forward to seeing you at Frognal soon.




Some donors choose to give from the United States via BSUF - the British Schools and Universities Foundation, a grant making organisation which supports UCS.

UCS Bursaries

Through the support given this year UCS can offer a further sixteen years of bursary provision – that's the equivalent of just over two pupils' seven-year education at the school. This, along with the school's provision for bursaries, means we are able to offer the equivalent of 57 fully funded places at the school. The Kenneth Durham Memorial Bursary

Members of the UCS community were invited to contribute to a bursary in honour of former Headmaster, Kenneth Durham. **£146,998** has been given so far, which is enough to support four students through Sixth Form careers at UCS.

In conjunction with the KJD Bursary, senior school classrooms were renovated and a centre for Social Sciences was opened in Ken's memory. "I had little hesitation in supporting the Ken Durham Memorial Bursary to enable a student to study the social sciences in the Sixth Form at UCS. Ken himself was a keen advocate of independent thought and analysis together with the promotion of the individual to make the very best of their academic and extra-curricular potential: educating the whole person is what the UCS Sixth Form is all about.
