





#### AKO CENTRE Innovation in learning and teaching

The new centre embodies the essence of a UCS education and brings together the resources to learn the fundamental skills that will stand our pupils in good stead far beyond school, no matter what they choose to do. Embedding a culture of projectbased learning and educational research at UCS, it houses the library, areas for independent and collaborative work and study, a discussion and learning forum and a classroom for innovation in learning and teaching.

**THE PRE-PREP ECO GARDEN** Brought to life by support from The Rose Foundation

This garden has transformed a previously under used space into a key part of the Pre-Prep School's lessons. Science and creative curriculum sessions now have outdoor learning elements where pupils nurture flowers, herbs and vegetables, taking great care and pride as they watch them grow. They are also learning about organically reducing waste by using a new school wormery for leftovers from their packed lunches.





**Bursaries.** Provision for Bursaries can provide life-long opportunities. Each year we invite our leavers' families to contribute to their *Class Gift*, which supports others who could benefit from the UCS education they have had.
