



THE AKO SIXTH FORM CENTRE

The UCS Community is fortunate to have benefitted from the generosity of the AKO Foundation, which was established in 2013 by Nicolai and Katja Tangen. To date, the AKO Foundation has approved grants in excess of **£100 million** to support charitable causes that improve education, promote the arts or mitigate climate problems.





The AKO Sixth Form Centre will open in 2021. The design was conceptualised with input from current pupils, who wanted to incorporate sustainability as the central theme of the design. The redeveloped Sixth Form Centre will be a modern and open space to encourage collaborative learning, as well as more focused, individual study.
